### ***Announcing the forthcoming MEN (Male Employment Network) program!***

***12 Positions available***

***Now accepting resumes***

The MEN (Male Employment Network) program is for young men aged 18-30 who are not currently employed or not attending school, or not receiving Employment Insurance benefits. It is a 20 week program to prepare them for work or returning to school.

It may be considered to be a "brother" program to TAPP's current successful initiative, FEM (Female Employment Mentoring).

It consists of Personal/Career Development for 2 weeks, then 18 weeks paid placement with non-profit and business organisations, Monday through Thursday. On Fridays participants will receive additional Personal/Career Development workshops.

Participants receive the minimum wage (\$10.25 per hour)

There are 12 positions available.

The program will begin in mid-September 2010, and end in March 2011.

#### **Program Qualifications:**

- age 18-30
- not currently employed full-time
- not currently in school full-time
- not receiving EI
- basic computer skills
- good English language skills
- Canadian citizen, or landed immigrant, or permanent resident, with a valid SIN (social insurance number)
