Sharks, sharks everywhere - so why are we so worried?

Learn about the latest research on several major Atlantic Canada shark species from Dr. Steven Campana, research scientist with the Bedford Institute of Oceanography in Nova Scotia. Shark populations tend to have low productivity. While theoretically they could be fished sustainably, the practice has often led to stock collapse. Explore how shark research in Canada not only helps understand shark biology, but provides important information on population health which aids in their conservation.
